

activity (although obviously some variation due to age, sex, overall attentiveness level, acuity of the senses, etc., may be found) and can be experimentally or otherwise determined.

It may only be hoped that in the near future research on human social and communicational behaviour, as well as investigations on situational and ecological factors affecting such behaviours, will tackle the problem of the spatial extent and spatial structure of the field of co-presence in a more fully fledged way. Further, it may be hoped that the above set of hypotheses will be verified carefully and that the list of findings will be made more conclusive and definite.
